Walton is home to the world's first nature reserve, situated on the grounds around Walton Hall now Waterton Park Hotel. Charles Waterton built a three mile long wall around his parkland. The wall was built in three stages and completed in 1826. In May 2026 it celebrates its 200th birthday: WallFest 26. WallFest 26 is a celebration of the completion of the wall and our heritage. More than 50 events have been organised around four strands:

- Creativity
- Heritage
- Wellbeing

Waterton Park is a hugely important place within the Wakefield District. It is widely considered to be the first nature reserve ever created, and therefore of international significance. HOW TO GET TO WALLFEST

The Nest is marked on the map.

By bus: Take a 195/196 and ask to get off at Cherry Tree Road, Walton. Cross the road. Walk back the way that you have come for 100m. Turn left, at the public footpath sign (opposite Walton Sports and Social Club). Take this footpath for approximately 700m.

By car: There is limited car parking at the golf club (The Balk, Walton, Wakefield WF2 6QL). Please park in the designated area and follow signs. This is more accessible for those with reduced mobility and is wheelchair friendly.

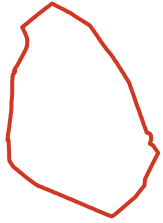

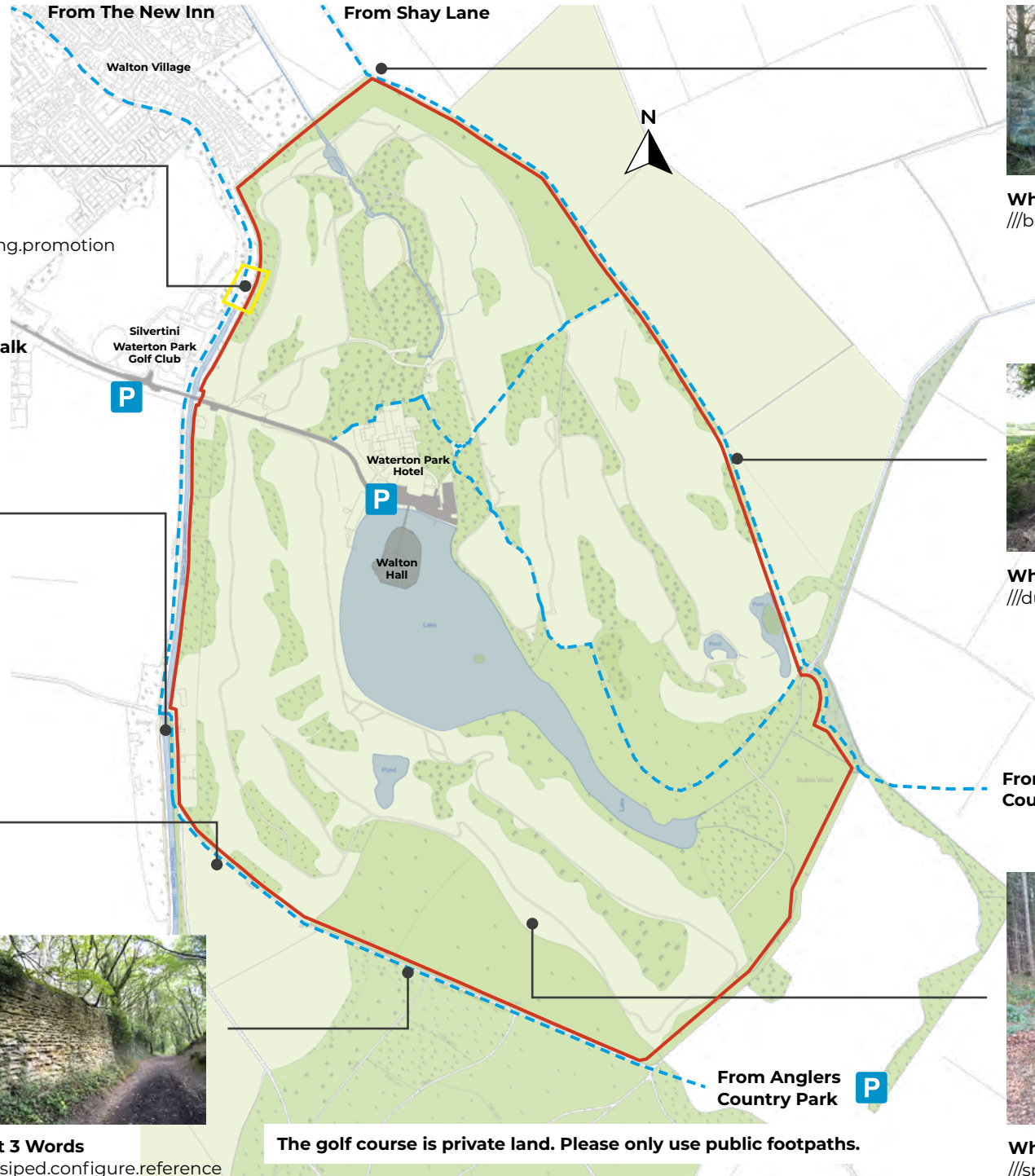
